7. The applicant and municipality executed a Host Community Agreement on February 21, 2018.
8. The applicant conducted a community outreach meeting on November 18, 2018 and provided documentation demonstrating compliance with Commission regulations.
9. The Commission received a municipal response from the municipality on July 10, 2019 stating the applicant was in compliance with all local ordinances and bylaws.
10. The applicant proposed the following programs for its Positive Impact Plan:
  - a. Advertise employment opportunities in publications within Greenfield, Amherst and Holyoke for its hiring initiatives that are designed to attract individuals from areas of disproportionate impact; and
  - b. Host a job fair two (2) times a year in Greenfield, Amherst, or Holyoke.

11. There were no concerns arising from background checks on the individuals or entities associated with the application.

5. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff with specific information, including types, forms, and flavors, as it pertains to the following proposed products: infused foods, infused beverages, and oils; and
6. Final licensure is subject to the applicant providing Commission staff with an updated Diversity Plan outlining specific measurable goals.

The applicant has demonstrated compliance with the laws and regulations of the Commonwealth and suitability for licensure. Therefore, the applicant is recommended for provisional licensure.
